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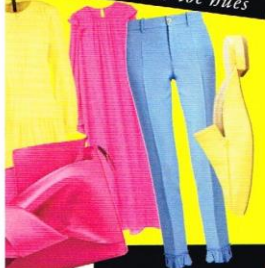

## THE LOWDOWN

EasyJet flies to Copenhagen from a number of airports around the United Kingdom. Flights from London start from about £70 ([easyjet.com](http://easyjet.com)). Stay at SP34, a beautifully decorated hotel in København with a stunning restaurant-come-greenhouse, which is like a secret garden in the city (from £225 per room, per night; [brochner-hotels.dk/hotel-sp34](http://brochner-hotels.dk/hotel-sp34)). If you're thinking Airbnb, go for the stylish Nørrebro district.

## COPENHAGEN FOR FASHIONISTAS

Inspiring street style and labels for that covetable laid-back-chic Scandi look make Copenhagen a must-visit for the style conscious. Laura Tender is a fashion design assistant and fashion blogger ([couturekulten.dk](http://couturekulten.dk)). She reveals where she loves to shop and hang out...

### THE AREA TO SHOP

Central, or 'Indre By' as we call it, is the historic centre of the town and where you can find all the great Scandi high-street brands, as well as international designers and amazing department stores. Magasin ([magasin.dk](http://magasin.dk)) and Illum ([illum.dk](http://illum.dk)) are two of the best big stores with do-not-miss shoe sections. The streets off the main shopping street, Strøget, are full of fabulous boutiques; my faves are Holly Golightly ([hollygolightly.dk](http://hollygolightly.dk)) for a great mix of feminine styles from Danish designers and high-end international brands. Lot29 ([lot29.dk](http://lot29.dk)) has the best selection of colourful bohemian wear including Missoni and Erdem, as well as a great beauty department. Check out Storm ([stormfashion.dk](http://stormfashion.dk)) for streetwear.

### CHIC SCANDI BRANDS TO BUY

Weekday Great for basics – they make the best plain sweatshirts, tees and denim (about £40 for a sweatshirt; [shop.weekday.com](http://shop.weekday.com)). Samsoe & Samsoe ([samsoe.com](http://samsoe.com)), Minimum ([minimum.dk](http://minimum.dk)) and Envi ([envii.com](http://envii.com)) are all really good for basics too.

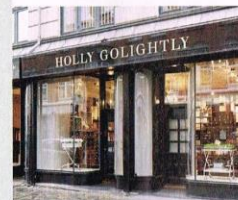
Munthe is a must visit for pieces that are feminine with the most beautiful prints (about £220 for a top; [munthe.com](http://munthe.com)).

Norse Projects ([norseprojects.com](http://norseprojects.com)) is a homegrown Danish brand mainly known for its menswear but does great womenswear, too, such as cute striped tops for £25.

Get previous Acne Studios collections as well as showpieces, samples and sale items at Acne Archive ([acnestudios.com](http://acnestudios.com)).

### BEST FOR VINTAGE FINDS

Lula 2ndhand Luxury is my favourite vintage store in Copenhagen – Lula has a great selection of international designers such as Dior, Louis Vuitton and Chanel, streetwear such as Y-3 and Nike, and Danish designers including Ganni, Lovschild 1979 and Saks Potts, all at less than half price. ▶







PARIS FOR FOODIES

From young chefs pulling inspiration from all corners of the globe to seasoned culinary talents putting a fresh spin on old formats, Paris is having a foodie moment. Lindsey Tramuta, a Paris resident and author of *The New Paris: The People, Places And Ideas Fueling A Movement* (£18.99, Abrams), advises where to enjoy good food – bon appétit!

**MUST-EAT NEO-BISTROS/BRASSERIES**  
Swerve the tourist-trap brasseries that charge a fortune for bad food and hit up a neo-bistro, where exciting new chefs combine fresh ingredients with modern cooking. Tannat is a produce-driven bistro with an ever-rotating menu. Dishes are graphic in presentation – a nod to the chef's past as a street artist. Lunch, €15 per head; dinner €35-€50 ([annat.fr](http://annat.fr)).

Le 52 Faubourg Saint-Denis is as comfortable for a morning coffee as it is for a romantic dinner. Dishes change regularly and play up once-forgotten vegetables. Lunch/dinner about €40-50 per head ([faubourgstdenis.com](http://faubourgstdenis.com)).

**CLASSIC MODERN BISTROS**  
A handful of established big-name chefs have also refreshed the classics. At Champeaux, Michelin-starred Alain Ducasse takes a beloved format and spices it up with better quality ingredients, a sleek decor and a central location in Les Halles market. Lunch about €20; dinner,

€30-60 per head ([restaurant-champeaux.com](http://restaurant-champeaux.com)).

One of the new generation of chefs, American-born Daniel Rose has revived two old-timers – La Bourse et la Vie and Chez la Vieille – making them both must-eat spots for traditional French food such as steak-frites made with top-shef fresh ingredients. La Bourse et la Vie, €55 per head ([labourselavie.com](http://labourselavie.com)); Chez la Vieille, €25 per head ([chezlavieille.fr](http://chezlavieille.fr)).

**SENSATIONAL STREET FOOD**  
While Parisian planning laws have scuppered a UK-style street scene, head for a "fast good food" joint. Boutique Yam Tch'a's steamed bao buns are served inside a discreet tea salon by Michelin-starred Yaeline Grattari (under €16; [facebook.com/boutique.yamtcha](http://facebook.com/boutique.yamtcha)). Cocktails and Korean barbecue come together at Hero (€36-50; [quixotic-projects.com/venue/hero](http://quixotic-projects.com/venue/hero)).

THE LOWDOWN

Eurostar from London to Paris costs from £58 return ([eurostar.com](http://eurostar.com)) or fly with [easyjet.com](http://easyjet.com). Stay at La Grand Pigalle, a lovely boutique hotel in the cosmopolitan 9th arrondissement, with a menu of refined Italian dishes created by Giovanni Passerini, a much-loved Roman chef working in Paris. Rooms from about £145 per night ([grandpigalle.com](http://grandpigalle.com)).

ZURICH FOR CULTURE CONNOISSEURS

Zurich has an exciting art scene thanks to more than 100 galleries. Blogger Tiphaine Marie ([tiphainemarie.com](http://tiphainemarie.com)) tells us the culture spots...

ART LOVE

Kunsthalle (Centre of Contemporary Art) is on the top floors of the Löwenbräu-Areal, a striking, red-brick former brewery, and is one of the best places to see contemporary art. If you're in an arty mood, then check out the other galleries situated there too ([kunsthalezurich.ch](http://kunsthalezurich.ch)).

One of the world's most respected galleries, Hauser & Wirth is known for showcasing the best artists in the world in 10 exhibitions throughout the year ([hauserwirth.com](http://hauserwirth.com)).

As well as the largest collection of paintings by Munch outside Norway, Kunsthauas has works by other big names, from Picasso to Rothko, plus local artists ([kunsthauas.ch/en](http://kunsthauas.ch/en)).

MUSIC HIGHS

At night, Jenseits, an airy space in the new hip part of town, Zurich West, hosts cool theatre plays, workshops, philosophical conversations and debates ([jenseitsimviadukt.ch](http://jenseitsimviadukt.ch)). When you're there, check out Frau Gerolds Garten ([fraueroald.ch](http://fraueroald.ch)), a buzzy outdoor spot of converted shipping containers, an urban garden and great views. Rote Fabrik, also in Zurich West, is known for great music concerts, from hip-hop to soul, jazz and rock ([rotefabrik.ch](http://rotefabrik.ch)). Zurich Open Air Festival, in August, boasts a good line-up – this year, it's got The Prodigy and Major Lazer on the bill ([zurichopenair.ch/en](http://zurichopenair.ch/en)).

WHERE TO FUEL UP

Rimini is a pool-party bar on the river. It's a bohemian paradise with exotic cocktails and, during the day, you can swim ([rimini.ch](http://rimini.ch)). Hiltl is the oldest veggie restaurant in the world (founded 1898) with lots of choice ([hiltl.ch/en](http://hiltl.ch/en)).

EasyJet flies to Zurich from around the UK. Flights from London start from about £40 ([easyjet.com](http://easyjet.com)). Stay at the Marktgasse hotel, which is luxe but welcoming with a central location and a library with a great selection of beautiful books (£240 per room, per night; [marktgasshotel.ch/en](http://marktgasshotel.ch/en)).
